### **Childcare Attendants Opportunities**

Megan Nguyen and Hillary Wong have faithfully served as our Childcare Attendants since we reopened for hybrid worship. Their last day with us will be April 14. They have served us well and will certainly be missed. We have posted the two positions for Childcare Attendants. We need one of our Childcare Attendants to be at least 18, and a second Childcare Attendant to be at least 16. We are posting these positions at \$15.45 /hour from 9:30-11:30 Sunday mornings. Please pass the word to anyone you think might be interested.

It can take time to fill these positions, so we would like to have a cadre of volunteers to cover the nursery until Childcare Attendants can be hired. Our goal is to keep the nursery open while the hiring process proceeds. Our hope is to have enough volunteers that no one would need to cover the nursery more than once or twice before we can get our hired Childcare Attendants in place. Per MPC policy, at least two childcare attendants need to be in the nursery at all times. We plan to have an iPad in the nursery so volunteers can still be part of the church service. #### Clackamas Women's Services by Linda Marquam, Outreach Chair

Donation Corner continues to feature Clackamas Women's Services through mid-April. The shelter staff have requested donations of



toiletries, e.g., shampoo, conditioner, body wash, soap, razors, and toothpaste.

Brenda Kinoshita, CWS Development Director, will give a hybrid presentation to MPC after worship on April 7.

CWS are a community that honors survivors of domestic and sexual violence, stalking, elder abuse and trafficking. Their programs and services are free and confidential. They support people of all gender identities, ages, or immigration statuses to ensure anyone escaping interpersonal violence can access the resources they deserve. Their mission is to break the isolation of domestic and sexual violence. Last year 1,403 survivors accessed their community-based services.

#### **Backpack Buddies** by Cherie Kennedy

So far this year, we have provided three food bag deliveries and have three more to go before Head Start ends the pre-school program for summer break (July-August). The families have all enjoyed the program and are most appreciative of the extra food. Currently there are about 20 families and 22 children in Early Head Start and Head Start.

If you would like to make a donation of fresh fruit or vegetables for the families, please let me know in order to coordinate the number of families and the delivery date for that month. You can also donate extra food items or snack items that have a stable shelf life; or make a donation through your regular giving – just designate the donations as: "Backpack Buddies".

### Be a helper at MPC


Join us in serving our neighbors and community:
